### October 12, 2019

On October 12, 2019 at approximately 10:10 AM, the Crow Wing County Sheriff's Office received a 911 call of a capsized boat on North Long Lake. It was initially reported that all four occupants from the boat and a dog were in the water. One of the occupants of the boat was able to place the 911 call to the Sheriff's Office.

The Crow Wing County Dispatch Center was able to locate an approximate location of the capsized boat using the GPS coordinates from the caller's phone. Crow Wing Deputies and North Ambulance personnel were directed to Drahos Road in First Assessment, which was the closest road to where the individuals were reported to be in the water.

Crow Wing County Recreational Division deputies were on duty at the time and responded.

A deputy was able to locate the four individuals and their dog, directly west of the cul-de-sac on Drahos Road. All four individuals had signs of being exposed to the cold water and air temperatures (Hypothermia). The deputy was able to escort/assist the four involved to a waiting ambulance, which was parked in the cul-de-sac on Drahos Road. All four individuals were transported to the hospital by North Ambulance personnel.

The four individuals involved were identified as;

- Alec Stark, (24) from Little Falls, MN
- Raymond Rohl, (22) from Pillager, MN
- Cody Lisson, (21) from Long Prairie, MN
- Brooke Waldorf, (23) from Osakis, MN

It was determined that all four individuals had been duck hunting on North Long Lake when their boat began to take on water due to high winds. All four individuals were wearing floatation devices and were able to make it to shore.

The Crow Wing County Sheriff's Office was assisted on this call by North Ambulance and the MN Department of Natural Resources.
